## A Buddhist Perspective on Society

Rev. Daijaku Kinst, PhD

Please join us as Rev. Daijaku Kinst will talk about how the Buddha dharma can support a deeper understanding of our society and how it can be expressed in beneficial ways.



Ordained in the Soto Zen tradition in 1988, Rev. Kinst is the dharma successor in the lineage of Shunryu Suzuki Roshi. After completing her formal priest training she went on to study Western psychology, obtaining a Masters degree and license in psychotherapy. During this time she also trained as a chaplain at UCSF Medical Center's Clinical Pastoral Education program. She has taught and led retreats in a variety of settings with teachers in the Soto Zen and other Buddhist traditions. She teaches graduate courses in Buddhist Studies, Contemplative Psychology, and Spiritual Direction and has an ongoing commitment to interfaith dialogue. Rev. Kinst received dharma transmission (full authorization to teach) from Rev. Sojun Weitsman. She received a Ph.D. in Buddhism and Psychology and teaches at the Institute of Buddhist Studies, Graduate Theological

Union, associated with the University of California, Berkeley.
